

Climate Change and Gender Policy Frameworks in Namibia

I. National Policy on Climate Change (2011)

- Recognizes the gender-differentiated impacts of climate change.

2. National Gender Policy (2010)

- Integrates gender considerations into various sectors, including environmental management and climate change initiatives.

3. National Adaptation Plan for Climate Change (NAPCC)

- Seeks to address vulnerabilities and promote resilience, considering gender dynamics in adaptation planning.

4. Climate Change Action Plan (2019-2025)

- Highlights the importance of gender mainstreaming in climate projects and programs.

5. Combating Desertification and Drought Policy (2019)

- Promotes women's involvement in combating desertification and sustainable land management.

WIAN Gender Integration Approaches to Climate change adaptation - examples

- Gender unequal perpetuate existing inequalities leaving the vulnerable worse off
- Gender exploitative take advantage of inequitable gender norms and existing imbalances in power to achieve project objectives
- Gender accommodating acknowledge the role of gender norms and inequalities and develop actions that adjust to and often compensate them
- Gender transformative actively attempt to examine, question and change harmful gender norms & the imbalance of power between women and men to reach gender equality & development objectives.

Barriers and limitations to address impacts of climate change

- While they **make tremendous contributions** to the social, economic, and cultural life of communities and society at large, indigenous women often face discrimination from both within and outside their communities.
- Indigenous Communities are missing out in many National climate change initiatives/programs, policies and decision-making policies.
- No/Inadequate resources directed to building indigenous people's resilience and adaptation to climate change.
- Traditional Knowledge not integrated in Climate Adaptation Strategies.
- Capacity Gaps; Negotiating Agreements
- Climate change threatens to make women and men still **more vulnerable** to such processes, besides creating new risks from climate-related shocks that include greater dependence on precarious work, and exposure to violence and human rights violations

- Integrate gender equality and women's empowerment in the Recovery Framework, sectorbased recovery plans, and monitoring and evaluation (M&E) frameworks for equitable resource allocation and needs prioritization
