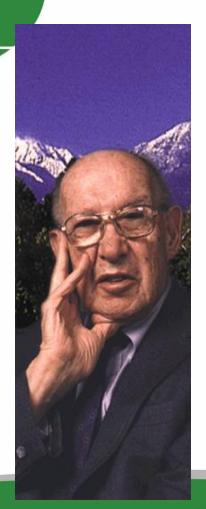



a targeted, integrated, and systematic approach




- to identifying, acquiring, creating, sharing, applying, and capturing knowledge,














CCARDESA's ICKM System Structure







KM Partnerships with CAADP-XP4 CONSORTIUM

- CCARDESA is also working with CAADCP-XP4 institutions with funding from the European union through IFAD to jointly implement KM activities
- Support KM national strategies, develop joint Knowledge products, visibility materials and the famous KM4AgD Challenge
- Implement the interoperable systems according to the Akosombo agenda
- ISO standards for KM and IT to be compliant to international standards
- Working now with AUC on communication & Advocacy to support reporting of the Malabo reporting.







KM Partnership in CCARDESA

SADC Secretariat's Food, Agriculture and Natural Resources (FANR) Directorate, CCARDESA the International Livestock Research Institute (ILRI) through the CGIAR Research Program on Climate Change, Agriculture and Food Security (CCAFS) and GIZ 'Adaptation to Climate Change in Rural Areas' programme (ACCRA), funded by the German Federal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ)

- Developed a <u>SADC Futures Foresight eLearning</u> and knowledge sharing platform housed at both CCARDESA and CCAFS websites;
- The 6-module course is accessible to anyone on and upon completion one is certified in foresight for climate resilience;
- The terms of the partnership were for CCAFS to provide the technical expertise in Foresight for climate resilience whereas CCARDESA provided the KM platforms and expertise to host the course and participants;
- Over 500 people have been certified and practising foresight for climate resilience in their respective organisations;

KM Partnership with GIZ







- In 2017 to 2020 CCARDESA
 partnered with GIZ to revamp its
 website at <u>ccardesa.org</u> and <u>Southern</u>
 <u>African Information Knowledge</u>
 <u>System Hub knowledge hub;</u>
- GIZ provided the technical expertise in KM and CCARDESA provided the KM hosting infrastructure and had the KM mandate in the SADC region
- By 2018, CCARDESA launched its knowledge hub which currently houses over 850 knowledge products available for researchers, academia, policy makers and private sector in the SADC region and beyond










KM Partnership with GIZ

- In 2019, CCARDESA partnered with GIZ to develop a CCARDESA Climate Smart Agriculture (CSA) Mobile learning app specifically designated for extension.

- It houses over 67 technical briefs and provides information relevant to the needs of the farmers.
- The app also takes suggestions and feedback from the farmers and extension through its discussion forum











CCARDESA KM Support to MS

- In 2021, CCARDESA partnered with GIZ through its Minimizing effects of Covid19 in the SADC region by purchasing state of the art conferencing equipment for 6 Member states to facilitate virtual meetings during the pandemic
- The partnership also allowed for supporting extension in the 16 SADC member states with 100 tablets to allow for easy contact between farmers and extension.













KM Partnership with C-NRM Project

- CCARDESA has partnered with GIZ-CNRM project to strengthen CCARDESA funding portals to facilitate easy access to funding opportunities
- It has also partnered with Natural resources institutions in the region to facilitate the creation of a training institutions database in the SADC region
- Revamp the expert database following the parameters from CAADP-XP4 Consortium to allow for interoperability with other databases.
- This will also strengthen the capacity of media in Climate resource management and transboundary issues for better reporting and information dissemination in the region.







KM Partnership with ICI Growing Greener Project

- CCARDESA has partnered with Peace Park International and Conservation international to implement the ICI Growing Greener Project.
- CCARDESA will strengthen and promote knowledge sharing platforms and events
- Promote digital communication tools
- It will also enhance communities of practice







KM Partnership with IMC on Digitization study

• CCARDESA has partnered with IMC with support from World Bank on the digitization study which has led to the development of the CCARDESA Digital Agri Hub which shows all Innovation technologies in Africa.







KM Partnerships via MOUs

- CCARDESA has partnered with the Southern Africa Resource & Documentation and Centre (SARDC) through an MOU to support the strengthening of KM in CCARDESA.
- SARDC will support CCARDESA to document lessons learned, best practices and success stories.
- Finalised an MOU with Access Agriculture to support the development of audio visual knowledge products in various languages.
- The main purpose of this partnership is broaden the formats through which information and knowledge is shared with SADC stakeholders.
- To meet all the information needs of the various target audiences that CCARDESA has
