- Implementation of MALABO commitments cuts across agricultural sector lead ministries which are MoA, MLF, MIT, MIE & MoF

- Tanzania Action plan on ICKM contribution in promoting MALABO Commitments and CCARDESA Themes was developed in November 2021
- The action Plan were shared and domesticated among key stakeholders in the Tanzania NARS during a capacity building workshop which was held in March 2022 in Dar es Salaam.
- Since then, efforts have been undertaken to work through the action plan

- Established 2,909 demonstration plots
- Organized and participated in agricultural exhibitions conducted at zonal, national and international level
- Prepared and disseminated 8,345 copies of knowledge products (103 posters, 5,715 leaflets, 1,017 fliers, 1,346 brochures, 87 banners and 77 signboards)









- 2. Capacity building of Extension Officers on improved climate resilient technologies
 - 82 Agricultural Extension Officers were trained on cassava production techniques, processing and use of digital tools for disease diagnosis


